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Focusing on maternity models of care: Strategies for designing, implementing and sustaining change.
Webinar series commences Thu 28th May 2020.

The aim of this group is to champion improved outcomes for women and babies, through the use of operational and clinical data to focus on evidence-based activities designed to reduce complications, increase service efficiency and enable woman and family centred care.

What does membership give you?

Membership of the Group entitles the service to:

- a comprehensive **annual benchmarking report**, including key indicators relating to the pregnant women's wellbeing, as well as antenatal, labour, birth, postnatal and neonatal outcomes for the previous 12 months;
- a **two-day annual workshop** focused on a challenging aspect of services provision as identified by members;
- an **annual survey of members** on issues relating to the topic of the workshop;
- Information and exemplars to support the development of **an action plan** for a service improvement activity for each service;
- communication with the Programme Manager to enable **active networking** among members;
- and support for development of **ad hoc reports**.

Early in the year members are invited to participate in planning the specifics of the workshop and changes to the Maternity Report.

Focus of the 2020 webinar series: The increasing complexity of pregnancies has placed exceptional pressure on maternity services.

The 2020 webinars will inform review and redesign of models of maternity care; **right place, right time, right woman; one model doesn't suit all**; how to improve the woman's journey through the system.



Health Round Table Reports that highlight these issues include:

- **Obstetrics/maternity Departmental Reports** for each service.
- **Inpatient Briefing Reports** based on Maternity DRGs for each service.

Maternity Improvement Group Report:

- **Maternity Improvement Group Benchmarking Reports** including the pregnant women's antenatal health profile, labour and birth, postnatal and neonatal indicators. These reports continue to be developed with input from members. For 2020 we are exploring the inclusion of the Robson Criteria as a framework for labour and birth indicators.

What do you need to do?


- Designate a maternity liaison representative to act as a key contact with The Health Roundtable on maternity-related issues

What does The Health Roundtable do?

- Produces reports extracting data from the inpatient episode collection, highlighting trends and differences in performance
- Works with key maternity contacts to organise the annual meeting and any special survey materials
- Invites expert speakers who can share innovative ideas on the key topic.
- Facilitates networking events to enable sharing of knowledge and information among members.
- Provides phone and webinar support to all members to assist with data interpretation



Relative stay index of caesarean deliveries
